Appendix 1

Teachers of the Lumbini Buddhist University are requested to write articles/academic paper following the guidelines given herewith and also invited to submit the articles/paper to the Faculty of Humanities and Social Science, Lumbini Buddhist University.

articles/papers to be written by the Teachers should include the flowing component

1. Abstract

The abstract must be concise in accordance with objectives, methods, analysis, conclusion and comprehensive reflection of the content. It must be self-contained, without abbreviations and references. The abstract should not be more that 150 words and be written in one paragraph. (Times New Roman, Font Size 10, Bold, Justified)

2. Key words

Enter at least 5 key words or phrases in order to reflect the core content in alphabetical order, separated by commas (Times New Roman, Font Size 10 and Bold)

3. Introduction

The introduction of a seminar paper sets the tone for the entire document and provides readers with an overview of what to expect. Here are some key elements you might want to include in the introduction: Provide a brief background of the topic to give context to your readers. Clearly state the purpose of your articles/paper. What are you trying to achieve or investigate?

4. Objectives The objectives of the articles are to communicate information, present a coherent argument, and engage with them. The specific objectives may vary based on the nature of the academic discipline, and the purpose of the paper.

5. Analysis and discussion

The analysis and discussion part of the articles seminar paper is a critical section where the author interprets and examines the findings or information presented in the earlier sections, such as the literature review and methodology. This section provides the opportunity to demonstrate a deep understanding of the topic, critically analyze data or information, and discuss the implications of the findings

6. Conclusion

The conclusion of an articles serves as the final section where you summarize the key points, restate the main findings, and provide a sense of closure. It should leave a lasting impression on the reader and reinforce the significance of your work.

The paper should have appropriate subheadings to capture the details described and should be within 2500 to 3000 words including Cited Works. The manuscript inside each heading should be in Times New Roman, font size 10, justified alignment, and 1.5 line spacing. The first line of each paragraph is indentation by 0.14" tab space.



- Submissions will be judged on clarity, originality, authenticity, correctness, meaningful
 comparison, and contributions to research resources. Each submission will be reviewed
 internally and externally at least by evaluation committee member. If the submission is
 found suitable then it will be selected for presentation.
- Interested Teachers can choose any subject from Humanities, Social Sciences, Law, Management, Development Studies and Applied Buddhism. Content of the Paper should be based upon philosophy, literature, education, Culture and other sources concerning with the teaching learning activities of the LBU.
- Manuscripts should contain Title, Authors' names, Affiliation, E-mail address, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Literature, Proposed Approach, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion along with Cited works and Endnotes according to MLA (9th ed) format
- Margin
 Margin of the page is 1" at the top, bottom, right side and 1.5" on the left side of the Paper
 should be kept.
- Figures
 Such figures may include photographs, illustrations, multicolor graphs, and flowcharts.
 Figures are composed of only black lines and shapes. These figures should have no shades or half-tones of gray, only black and white.
- Citation of the articles should be according to MLA (9th Edition) or APA 7th Edition
- Articles releted to the Law should be written as per the Blue Book format 21th edition.
- Contact Information in separate page
