Formatting and Style Guidelines

- Language: Nepali or English
- Font: Times New Roman (12 pt.) for English or Preeti (16 pt.)/Kokila (16 pt.) for Nepali
- Originality: Submissions must be original, unpublished, and not under consideration elsewhere
- **Structure**: The paper must include a title that clearly indicates the subject and research issue. The paper should incorporate an introduction, literature review, statement of the problem, objectives, methodology, limitations, and other relevant sections, as outlined in the guidelines attached to the notice.
- Major Attention: The research article should contain identification of the research problem. The conclusion of the article must address the research problem. Otherwise, the article may not be accepted.
- Priority will be given to English Papers.

- The paper should be between 3,500–5,000 words, including works cited. It should contain appropriate subheadings to clearly delineate the different sections. The manuscript should use Times New Roman (12 pt.) for English and Preeti (16 pt.) or Kokila (16 pt.) for Nepali with justified alignment and 1.5 line spacing within each section.
- **Evaluation Criteria**: Submissions will be evaluated based on clarity, originality, accuracy, meaningful comparison, and contribution to research. Each paper will undergo internal and external review by the evaluation committee members. Suitable submissions will be selected for presentation.
- Language: Nepali or English
- Margins: 1 inch on the top, bottom, and right; 1.5 inches on the left.
- Figures: Include black-and-white images (e.g., photographs, illustrations, graphs, flowcharts) with no shading or gray tones.
